The Karen Benham Memorial English Award

Named after the late Karen Benham, a beloved English teacher at Providence for 25 years. She was greatly respected by her colleagues for her dedication and love of literature. Mrs. Benham passed on her love of literature and the English language to her many students until her premature death of cancer in 2001. This award, in her memory,

recognizes an outstanding student in English whose love for literature and language is evident in the student's work, both written and verbal.

The Sister Joseph Louise Mathematics Award

Named after the late Sister Joseph Louise, who served at Providence from 1955 through 1965. She headed the Math and Science Department and taught a variety of math classes while here. In 1961, she inaugurated the "Mathematical Association of America Award," which was bestowed on a graduating senior for outstanding mathematical achievement. One year following her departure, the annual mathematics award was renamed in her honor – the Sister Joseph Louise Mathematics Achievement Award. It has been presented annually for 52 consecutive years.

Norma Reynolds Science Award

Named after the late Norma Reynolds, who served Providence for 21 years (1968-1989) as teacher of chemistry, physics, and biology. This award was established in 1990 and has been awarded annually ever since. Ms. Reynolds was an extremely dedicated and highly respected teacher of science who impacted students for more than two decades.

The Judith Manning Social Studies Award

Named in honor of Jude Manning (Hon. '16), who is retired in 2018 after 34 years at Providence. This award is given to a senior who has excelled in social studies and has a desire to major or minor in history in college. Ms. Manning's teaching career has spanned over 40 years, the majority of that time spent as a member of the Providence Social Studies Department. Her love of history and enthusiasm for teaching has been an inspiration to many Providence students. Hard work, dedication and a desire to make a difference have all been core principles modeled by Ms. Manning.

Kathleen Polansky Theology Award

Named in honor of Kathleen Polansky, who taught theology at Providence for 30 years.
